INCREASED UTILITY RATES

We are committed to keeping the city finances solvent and transparent. Each year at the budget review, we make sure that our utility accounts are keeping pace with what the city is being charged for these services. Hooper City appreciates all our residents, and please note that this decision was made with careful consideration of the expenses and budgetary needs of the city.

The following rates will be increased effective July 1, 2026.

- **1st weekly green garbage can** - \$16.00 (Increase of \$.50 from current rate)
- **Additional weekly garbage can** - \$11.00 (increase of \$.50 from current rate)
- **Bi-weekly blue recycling can** - \$10.00 (Increase of \$.50 from current rate)
- **Additional bi-weekly blue recycling can** - \$10.00 (increase of \$.50 from current rate)
- **Monthly Sewer Assessment** - \$74.70 - (increase of \$4.62 from current rate, this includes \$21.90 to Central Weber Sewer, \$52.80 to Hooper City for bond payment and maintenance)
- **Monthly Storm water collection and disposal** - \$8.00 (increase of \$2.00 from current rate)
- **Cemetery rates for plots, perpetual care and interment are increasing. Please see complete listing on Fee Schedule/Hooper City Website. hoopercity.gov**
- **Resident Cemetery Plots - This rate increase will not be effective until October 1, 2026.**

Proposed Property Tax Impact Schedule
 Hooper City
 Fiscal Year 7/1/2026 to 6/30/2027

Hooper City will consider an increase to its property tax from .000283 to .000417 (estimated) to generate an additional \$128,000. The following information is intended to provide decision makers and the public with an explanation of how the City's operations would be affected if the proposed property tax increase is adopted.

Impact of Tax Increase- The additional cost associated with Weber County Sheriff's police services (including them hiring 6 new officers) – This will be a continued cost to the City. Therefore, it is not advised to use Fund Balance to fund these increases.
