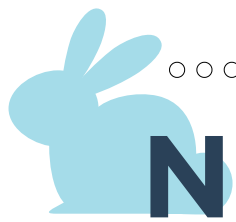

OPEN BURN POLICY

Residents planning to conduct open burning must obtain a permit through the Weber Fire District in coordination with the Utah Division of Air Quality.

Burning is only allowed during designated burn windows, requires an approved permit, and must meet daily air quality requirements.

Before burning, residents must:

- Apply for and receive a valid open burn permit
- Check that the Airshed Clearing Index meets the required level
- Follow all safety guidelines

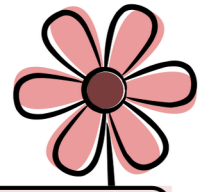

Acceptable Material

- Household junk and clutter (clothing, toys, etc.)
- Household items including appliances and furniture.
- Yard Waste (Tree limbs, shrubbery, grass clippings, etc.)
- Materials like wood, drywall, siding, tile, and carpeting are generally acceptable.

Items such as wood, drywall, siding, tile, and carpeting can only fill up to $\frac{1}{3}$ of the container.

Unacceptable Material

- Pesticides (bugkiller solutions)
- Herbicides (weed killer solutions)
- Solvents (paint thinner, alcohol, acetone, and similar solutions)
- Paint
- Motor Oil
- Gasoline or Diesel
- Tires
- Batteries
- Fuel tanks (propane, butane, etc.)
- Rock or Dirt
- Concrete
- Asphalt
- Animal Waste
- Refrigerators or Freezers
- Air Conditioners
- Metal car parts
