WASTE MANAGEMENT

OPEN BURN POLICY

Residents planning to conduct open burning must obtain a permit through the Weber Fire District in coordination with the Utah Division of Air Quality. Burning is only allowed during designated burn windows, requires an approved permit, and must meet daily air quality requirements.

Before burning, residents must:

- Apply for and receive a valid open burn permit
- Check that the Airshed Clearing Index meets the required level
- Follow all safety guidelines
